Construction:

WE HAVE A (La Cañada) HOMETOWN PARADE– READY FLOAT !



Float:

<u>Chassis:</u> It's been a very busy number of weeks since our last report. We pushed hard to hit a major milestone: getting our floats ready for the La Cañada Flintridge Hometown Parade on Monday, July 5th. Everyone pulled together to make this important target date. A great deal of soap, detergent and loads of laundry have certainly been kept flowing as oil, grease, dirt and weld-spatter covered and exhausted volunteers made it home to be greeted by loving (and tolerant) family members!

The Construction chairs send a huge 'Thanks!' out to: Jeff Helgager, Pam Gossoo, Randy Bartos, James Herrington, Chuck Hughes and Andrew Richmond.

The rear end and hitch and radiator "cage" are all complete. Nearly all hydraulic lines have been replaced – those few hoses that are still en-route to us have been temporarily re-installed using the old hoses. Additionally a full new modular driver pod frame has also been fabricated and installed.

This means that officially **all of our deferred maintenance and required upgrades are complete**; we are ready to now get on with building: "Who Says We Can't?"

Next steps:

 Decorate and display our chassis and upcoming design in the July 5th La Canada Hometown Parade! <u>Track-Trolley:</u> Pam Gossoo is preparing to be the new Henry Ford and getting ready for an assembly line approach to trolley cart manufacturing.

<u>Trees and Mechanicals (Mechs)</u>: Now as part of the actual build we will be looking at designing and building the surface characters that will be on the float landscape. We have swaying trees, a balancing dog on a slackline, a dog on a teetering skatepark rail, and also a dog on the satellite all to create.





Characters:

Grant Delgatty has initiated foam carving classes, and foam characters are emerging like statues out of fine Italian marble. Well, it's something like that at least. So, carvers, we love you and we need you . . . keep coming out and bring your character to life. (Reminder to our foam carvers: this activity REQUIRES a respirator to insure you do not inhale foam dust. We do have some if you forget yours or do not have one of your own. Satellite(s):

The satellite drive-pod is cleaned-up and restored. It's even gone to the local drive-thru for coffee! The Satellite body has been painted into a nifty checkerboard pattern by our artistic paint, character carving and deco team of Sue Beatty, Ann Neilson and Pam Wiedenbeck. So the Satellite is ready to go! (and also ready to start "showing up in town"... here and there There will be fun "LCFTRA Satellite Sightings" for swag and to raise awareness.)



The LCFTRA 2022 Rose Parade entry: "Who Says We Can't?"







Deco:

Rain Forest Fiesta: Concept to Post Parade

The first LCFTRA float that I worked on from Concept Contest Review to Post Parade was 'Rain Forest Fiesta'. I was no longer 'Float Liaison' and was finishing my six-year run as a new tournament member with my first year on the Formation Area Committee, a Pasadena Tournament of Roses committee which required very little but showing up on the evening of December 31.

I spent my first year really working on a float as Bob Neilson's go-fer. I cut steel for Bob's shaping; I hauled stuff for everyone; I screened; I painted and just when I thought I was home free and could relax on December 31, the day started with a partially decorated Xylophone key which had to be stripped down to steel, rescreened with cocooned screen, painted to match some flower that we actually had, installed so that the decorators could complete it before the judges showed up. Like most things LCFTRA, the result of so many people contributing to solving the problem was invisible to the judges – and even if it was

not perfect, the judges were so mesmerized by the xylophone Gecko striking the keys in time to the music, the keys themselves ceased to matter.
