We have completed the track for the characters. It will be mounted onto the chassis Saturday, September 4, 2021, if anyone wants to watch or help in this sizeable activity!

Additionally, we have employed assembly-line style building of the many track carts/trollies (Henry Ford would be marveling at us !) Hose replacement project is essentially complete; any remaining cleanup is not going to hamper progress. Radiator frames are done, and shrouds are in the home stretch.

Construction and Deco continue to refine the colors and materials for each item so we are all pointed in the same direction.

Track-Trolley:

Pam Gossoo is performing heroic Yeoman's efforts to get our trollies built! She is preparing to be the new Henry Ford and getting ready for an assembly line approach to trolley cart manufacturing.



Satellite:

The Satellite body will be re-foamed and recarved. Currently this is awaiting overall foaming schedule. The drive pod and the Satellite chassis are essentially done otherwise. So, Satellite is taking a break while we work the main float. (Though it could still be ready to start "showing up in town" .. here and there.... So some fun "LCFTRA Satellite Sightings" for swag and to raise awareness are still possible!)



Characters:

Welcome back Chuck Terhune! Who knew he was such a master sculptor! Come see our characters quickly coming to life.

Trees and Mechanicals (Mechs): Immediate focus will now be on the final design and approach to affecting this animation, as well as the surface characters that will be on the float landscape.

We have swaying trees, a balancing dog on a slackline, a dog on a teetering skatepark rail, and also a dog on the satellite all to create... Come one, come all!

Remember When: A Past President Looks Back

Dog Gone: Concept to Post Parade

The last time that LCFTRA went to the dogs was the 2014 float, 'Dog Gone!" Maybe dogs inspire float designers and challenge engineers. For the longest time, even after Ann Neilson got a donation for the naming rights from individuals on the board of the Pasadena Humane Society for \$5,000 to name the dog catcher, Steve, the question of how to animate the pants seemed far away in August with time to finish passing almost impossibly fast.

"Time flees;" or, as in the English proverbial saying: "Time flies." German clock makers inscribed this Roman saying on clock faces. Cicero meant it as a swipe at the lawmakers of his time who could diddle around in the detail without ever coming to a decision. Animators struggle with ever more complex ways to awe crowds from the free-form pants for Steve to this year's first roller coaster and telescoping trees.

I am not sure that our current float testers remember an unwritten 'rule of thumb' that at T1, floats should be approximately 60% complete. With float tests now set for October, the challenge becomes daunting.

Homework and weekday work become the norm rather than the exception. The float builders show up at multiple times during the week (morning and evening), and even work at home. The float designer and chief engineer are turning out the final drawings. The deco chairs are finalizing material decisions and getting a preliminary order ready. The chief troll and his crew are starting to send letters and line up food for the 700 plus volunteers that arrive the last week in December.

As a child, the clock seemed to slow down between September and December. Now, it seems that time is indeed fleeing as we aim for our final milestone of January 1, 2022.

Join us to help slow down the clock on Saturday from now until deco week at the float site. There is more than enough work for willing hands.
