Remember When: A Past President Looks Back



"They call me a troll." Old Norse Legends

When I first started float building with LCFTRA, for the 2006 parade, I felt like I had to learn a new language. I already understood 'float' to be the thing being built for the Tournament of Roses Parade. Yet in my first minutes with "The Great Howldini,' I was introduced to additional and obscure language. I came to understand that the "chassis" was the automotive component of a float, "animation" referred to the entire hydraulic system that created the special effects, and the "tow bar" was that hidden piece of metal that should never become exposed during the parade. I had an interesting introduction to the "tow bar" during "T2", the second float inspection which of course followed "T1", the first inspection, and "MI", the Mechanical Integrity test. Construction Chair, Dustin Crumb, devised a challenge for me--the poor, 'float aid.' To extract that "tow bar" required removing the title sign, throwing it up onto the deck (about nose level on me), then removing the bar before ever trying to attach it to the "tow ball".

I had quickly learned the terms, "Driver," "Observer" and "Animator" and was able to identify those trusted with more than 30,000 pounds of steel and flowers. However, my first time decorating for LCFTRA, I was always being asked to get a "troll" for some tasks related to plumbing, electrical, moving and sweeping. Careful observation identified the "trolls" as those dressed for physical labor, in very warm clothing that looked as if it was a part of them.

However, I was unprepared for the larger than life "King Troll": Clyde Hemphill. We developed a long and respectful relationship that started with a broom "Under the Bridge".

In old Norse sources, trolls are said "to dwell in isolated mountains, rocks, caves, and under stone bridges". To be a Troll was a trusted role required for the smooth operation of Decoration. Well, the 210 Bridge over the Flintridge Prep Parking lot is the 21st century equivalent of a cave or bridge; cold, damp, windy, and sometimes dark and shadowy. As a newcomer, I quickly learned who the trolls were, but always took my direction from the "King Troll" himself.

As I moved from role to role on the Board, I quickly learned that the "King Troll" knew about everything related to the logistical process of getting the float on the road. I will greatly miss Clyde Hemphill's presence during the all-too short December devoted to completing the float. I am also sure that the spirit of Clyde, which left this earth early in November, will be overseeing the success of the new Trolls. I am sure that LCFTRA will have many "Chief Trolls" as part of their future. But, there will only be one "King Troll". So, to Clyde, "rest in peace" and be sure to organize the afterlife as effectively as you did the "Under the Bridge" operation for LCFTRA.



Construction

We made it through the high winds!

One challenge of building our float 100% outside is that our intermediary work often has to stand up to the elements, including the gusty Santa Ana winds that recently swept across Southern California. Well, we made it through the high winds with no damage to the float or the characters!

FLOAT:

Chassis: One backend frame and support brackets are fabricated; just waiting for certified welders to come in and do their thing. We've got the bugs worked out of the track, for all the characters to go around smoothly. We're also about 90% complete with pencil rod work!

Next steps:

Chassis: Complete pencil-rod and chicken wire. Target to get the sheeting completed the first weekend in December, ahead of foaming on the 7th of December.

Characters: Continue refining detailed features on the characters. Feel free to come out and join Chuck Terhune, Sue Beatty, Pam Wiedenbeck in this effort!

Trees and Mechanicals (Mechs): We've begun the tree tilt structure. This will be a very tall component of the float and require a substantial stow mechanism and deco process. This one will require muscle and special attention. All help is welcome!

Site: A continued beehive of activity. We can use all the help we can get, so don't let the crowd of crazy elves working all over scare you off!

Come out and see what's up - so much to do, can't even list it all here! Inviting all to come by, come see and get hooked!

It's time to decorate again! We can't wait to welcome everyone back under the bridge to cover every bit of "Who Say's We Can't" with floral materials. There are still plenty of decorating spots open- go to the "Calendar" section at www.lcftra.org to sign up for your shift. If you will be joining us here are a few reminders for having a great time, since it has been a while for us all!

- Please arrive at your shift a little early and bring lots of patience. At the beginning of each shift, we need to get people checked in, COVID-cleared, and assigned their jobs, which may take a little more time than normal.
- Wear layers, not headphones! We can never predict what the weather will be like, so make sure to dress in layers, and make sure that you don't mind if those outer layers get glue/paint on them- it will not wash out! Plus, don't forget that we don't allow headphones while decorating- we need to be able to communicate with you quickly to keep you safe, and get the float finished.
- Every job counts. In order to build the float, we need many people working together to make it happen. Some jobs may include vialing roses, making a seed mixture, applying beans (so many beans!), or taking supplies back and forth from people on scaffolding. We need every single one of these jobs to be successful and appreciate your willingness to do them all.
- Have fun! It's incredible watching the float come together over the course of a week. If you ever have any questions or don't understand what you need to be doing, check in with your crew chief. We are here to help you succeed.
