

WE HAVE FOAM !

We passed T2!

FLOAT:

Chassis: We have a fully foamed float. The construction team and many others have worked extra hard and kept the adrenaline flowing. It has taken the efforts of so many to get this far. Thanks go out to Pam Gossoo, Jeff Helgager, Bob , Randy Bartos, Rich Boccia, Nancy Wolhaupter, Chuck Terhune, Tim Rahtz, Sue Beatty, Pam Wiedenbeck, Jim Neilson, Tanya and Amar Miller, and Chuck Hughes as our regulars - and we also have a quite a few weekend volunteers that made welding, track, mechanical animation devices, screening, sheeting, cutting, wiring, hoses, painting, foam prep.... This was a particularly hard-fought deadline, and a little rain only added to the hurdle race we ran. Thanks to all !

We accomplished another major and critical milestone known as T2 on Saturday December 18th. At this inspection we once again drove the float out on the street to be tested and inspected on all animation mechs., a fire drill for float operators to insure a safe escape, and general approval and alignment. This is a big deal and our final milestone before deco week. So, there is light at the end of the tunnel.... And it doesn't appear to be an oncoming train, so looking good!





Next steps:

Chassis: Now that we are 'foamed in solid'... we cut our way back inside and get all the mechanicals running, and setting the stage for deco to take over. Kinda like cocoon being opened.

Track propulsion: Done. Thanks, Randy Bartos, for the engineering!

Characters: Basically done - the dogs are in their final grooming and prep for the big show. Thanks to Chuck Terhune, Nancy Wolhaupter, Sue Beatty and Pam Wiedenbeck!

Trees and Mechanicals (Mechs): Trees are complete, frame and mount for them is complete and the tilting stow mechanism is active – and impressive in its' sheer magnitude. All we need to do is some final welding and then assembly. This will occur throughout this week and by Friday night (because it needs to be active for T2) as mentioned last time....this is a big thing and will require muscle and equipment to mount upon the float chassis. Come Friday to watch what is sure to be interesting.

Satellite: Is not sitting still - it too has been freshly foamed, and also has its animated rocking Jet ski mounted aloft. It too will receive one of our dogs to pilot the Jet ski.

Site: Near 24/7 hive of activity. We can use all the help we can get: remember the country is expecting a show on New Year's Day... and we are a unique and integral part of bringing an exciting New Year to the U.S.

Come out and see what's up - so much to do, can't even list it all here! Inviting all to come by, come see and get hooked!
